AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING EXTENSION OF WATER LINES AND FOR SUBMISSION OF CONTRACT FOR SUCH EXTENSION TO COMPETITIVE

Be it ordained by the Board of Commissioners of the City of Tatum, Texas:

That the water system operated by the city shall be extended as follows: A 2" cast iron line approximately 4500 feet running East from a point at A. P. Matthews, Sr. residence to the Negro School; one railroad crossing; one highway crossing; one wet connection; eight expansion joints; two 2" valves complete with boxes, service connections and curb stops, installation of meters and meter boxes; line to be buried 30" in depth. Since such extension will probably involve the expenditure of more than \$2000.00 and will require the issuance of time warrants, the contract for such extension shall be submitted to competitive bids under the provisions of Article 2368a, Revised Statutes of Texas: that the City Secretary post the proper notice of the letting of such contract and of the Board's intention to issue time warrants, providing that the installation of meters and meter boxes shall not be a part of the contract.
