WHEREAS, the City Commission of said City duly ordered an election to be held in said City on the 7th day of September, 1963, on the Propositions hereinafter stated; and

WHEREAS? said City Commission has investigated all matters pertaining to said election, including the ordering, giving notice, officers, holding, and making returns of said election; and

WHEREAS, the election officers who held said election have duly made the returns of the result thereof, and said returns have been duly delivered to said City Commission.

THEREFORE, BY IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF TATUM:

- l. That the City Commission officially finds and determines that said election was duly ordered, that proper notice of said election was duly given, that proper election officers were duly appointed by the City Commission prior to said election, that said election was duly held, that dure returns of the result of said election been made and delevered, and that the City Commission has duly canvassed said returns, all in accordance with law.
- 2. That the City Commission officially finds and determines that ony resident, qualified electors who own taxable property in said City and who have duly rendered the same for taxation were allowed to vote at said election, and that the following votes were cast at said election on each Proposition submitted:

58 Votes;

"FOR THE ISSUANCE OF SEWER SYSTEM REVENUE BONDS"

64 Votes;

"AGAINST THE ISSUANCE OF SEWER SYSTEM REVENUE BONDS"

33 Votes;

PROPOSITION NO. 2.

"FOR THE ISSUANCE OF SEWER SYSTEM TAX BONDS"

61 Votes;

"AGAINST THE ISSUANCE OF SEWER SYSTEM TAX BONDS"

38 Votes:

3. That the City Commission officially finds, determines and declares the result of said election to be that each of said Propositions so submitted has received a favorable majority vote and has carried, and that all of said bonds may be issued in accordance with law.

In other business Mr. A. S. Koehler, president of Wyatt C. Hedrick Engineering Corporation, of Houston, Texas, met and talked to the Commission about a contract to proceede with the engineering on the proposed projects. The Commission decided to take his proposition under consideration, but no official action was taken at this time.
